Viking homes called longhouses. They were simple log houses. Houses were usually one big, long, rectangular room with a central open fire, and a hole in the roof to let out the smoke.

Fur rugs covered the floor, the benches, and sometimes the walls. Windows were in roofs and covered with thin animal skin.

Domestic animals lived inside the house at night.
