Families with boys hang colourful carp kites, called Koinobori, outside their houses. The kites move in the wind and look beautiful, as you can see in the photo.

In Japanese culture, the carp (or koi) represents courage and perseverance, as the fish swims against the current upstream.



The Black Carp represents father because the colour represents the strength,

Red Carp represents mother meaning the birth.

Green or blue carp represents the boys.

Pink or orange represents girls in the family."
