







Possessives Adjectives



That's **our** house.



Its home is on a tree



How old is **your** sister?



My mom is a doctor



She's washing **her** hair.

We use possessive adjectives:
to show **something**
belongs to somebody:



You need to clean **your** teeth.



He broke **his** arm.



This is **their** school.

Be careful!

The possessive adjective **ITS** doesn't have an apostrophe (')

EXAMPLE:

*That bird broke **its** (NOT ~~it's~~) wing.*
(*it's* always means *it is* or *it has*)



Its beak is yellow



The dog broke **its** leg



Its eyes are blue
